NEW Front Row Clinic

6. CLUB ACCOUNTS

Our clubs in Levels 5 and below are reminded that they are required to submit a set of their accounts to Kent County RFU, as shown in Regulation 5.1

'RFU Regulations 5.1 – Sending copies of accounts

5.1.3 On or before 31 December each year, each club at Levels 1 to 4 (inclusive) shall send to the RFU's Chief Financial Officer and every other club shall send to the treasurer of their respective Constituent Body or other relevant organising body for inspection, a properly prepared financial statement for the previous season as presented to Club members at a general meeting that has been audited (if applicable) or examined as appropriate in accordance with Regulations 5.1.4 and 5.1.5.'

Clubs who are participating in Levels 1- 4 are required to submit their accounts to the NCA, however, we are advised by the RFU that it is of course best practice for Clubs in Levels 1-4, to submit to the Constituent Body also.

Most clubs submit their accounts each year as a matter of routine, but we are still missing quite a few. Each year, the RFU issue an audit of our clubs and we have to sign a document to the effect that all of our clubs have fulfilled all the regulations.

If you are reading this as your club's Honorary Treasurer, please check that your club is up-to-date, and if not please submit a set of accounts to **hon-treasurer@kent-rugby. org** by 20th March.

8. MENTORING AWARD

Ever found yourself in a mentoring role and felt inexperienced to fulful the role? England Rugby have produced a mentoring course to make you feel more qualified for the role.



Mentoring is a powerful tool that can be used in the development and education of people involved in Rugby.

Everyone involved in the game can benefit from an effective mentoring programme. Successful programmes enhance behaviour and practice, but in order for change to occur, learning must take place.

This mentoring training course will explore how you, in your role as a mentor, can support an individual through their learning journey.

The course costs £175 however, if you book on to the course please get in touch with the office at Kent County RFU as there is funding available for 10 places who go on to complete the course.

This is part of Kent County's objective to assist clubs in developing their coaches, referees and volunteers to help player rentention and recruitment.

9. YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID COURSE

England Rugby are offering CB's a two day course for individuals to qualify as a Youth Mental Health First Aider.



The course qualifies you as a YMHFA giving you:

- 1. An in depth understanding of young people's mental health and factors that affect wellbeing.
- 2. Practical skills to spot the triggers and signs of mental health issues.

- 3. Confidence to reassure and support a young person in distress.
- 4. Enhanced interpersonal skills such as non judgemental listening.
- 5. Knowledge to help a young person recover their health by guiding them to further support- whether that's through self help sites, their place of learning, the NHS, or a mix- engaging with parents, carers and external agencies where appropriate
- 6. Ability to support a young person with a long term mental health issue or disability to thrive.
- 7. Tools to look after your own mental wellbeing.

If a CB can confirm a course a 50% discount will be applied making it £150 per person. (16 candidates per course). If there is sufficient demand Kent RFU RugbySafe are looking to hold a course during the off-season.
